## **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor McOmie called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING**

Ordinance 1207 Rezoning

Planning Commission Chairman Dan Hudson explained the rezoning request from Lander Economic Development Association (LEDA). He stated there are two phases to the issue, right now phase I is under subdivision review. The Planning Commission recommended the rezoning from PL-Public Lands District to C - General Commercial District.

Dan Hudson stated, personally, he liked anything to enhance commercial facilities to the City.

Council President Maestas stated Union Cellular was looking for a location to install a tower for their additional fiber installation. LEDA approached the State of Wyoming to lease the property known as the Lander Technical Park. A 5 year lease was signed with the State of Wyoming and LEDA. Within that five years LEDA will need to submit a master plan for the site. After the State of Wyoming accepts their master plan for the site, the State of Wyoming will sign a 25 year lease.

Clerk Griffin stated no protests were filed. Planning Commission Chairman Hudson stated the proposed covenants that will be filed with the amended subdivision, at a later date, has seven exclusions to the commercial zone.

Council President Maestas declared a conflict of interest since he is on the board of LEDA.

The public hearing was closed at 6:38 p.m.
